Leadership Luncheon Celebrates Scouting's 100th Anniversary Major Gift Announced from AEP



On February 8, 2010 Scouting supporters gathered at the Ohio Statehouse to celebrate the 100th Anniversary of the BSA. United States Senator Sherrod Brown was the event's keynote speaker and was presented the Report to the State from Simon Kenton Council Scouts. Included in the Report were membership numbers for Scouting programs across the state of Ohio including: 98,473 Cub Scouts, 32,321 Boy Scouts, 5,698 Venturers, and 31,177 Explorers and Learning for Life participants. The state also had 1,798 Eagle Scouts.

Announced at the event was a generous gift of \$70,000 from American Electric Power of Ohio in support of Scouting's programs during the 100th Anniversary year.

Historical Merit Badges for 2010

In honor of the BSA's 100th Anniversary, today's generation of Scouts have the unique opportunity to experience some of the activities that Scouts of yesterday enjoyed. The BSA's new Historical Merit Badge Program is a set of four discontinued merit badges that today's Scouts can earn. Scouts can earn any or all of these merit badges:

- Signaling - First offered in 1910 and discontinued in 1992.
- Tracking - First offered in 1911 (as Stalker merit badge) and discontinued in 1952.
- Pathfinding - First offered in 1911 and discontinued in 1952.
- Carpentry - First offered in 1911 and discontinued in 1952.

There is one catch: Scouts must start and finish all requirements within the year 2010. So don't delay—after Dec. 31, 2010, these merit badges will go back on the "retired" list. Remember, these merit badges will be available during 2010 only. Requirements will only be available online. No merit badge pamphlets will be printed. BSA 100th Anniversary Coin Has a Release Date



Beginning March 23, the United States Mint will make available for sale 350,000 high quality, modern issue, commemorative silver dollar coins.

For the first thirty days the proof coin will be offered at \$39.95 and the uncirculated coin will be offered at \$33.95, after which the prices will be \$43.95 and \$35.95, respectively. We expect this limited quantity of coins to sell fast! While orders cannot be placed in advance, beginning at noon (ET) on March 23, 2010 orders can be placed through the United States Mint at www.usmint.gov or at 1-800-USA-MINT.

Troop 317 of Tri-Creek District Raises over \$4,000 toward Family Friends of Scouting

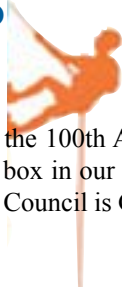
